SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is with much pleasure that I present on behalf of the Management Committee the Thirteenth Annual Report of the Ku-ring-gai District Soccer Association.

1969 was the year of "happenings" and "doing your own thing". This mod diction is perhaps applicable to the activities this year of the K.D.S.A.. Because of many people "doing their own thing" much has been achieved Soccerwise in Ku-ring-gai.

This has been the year of progress. Progress with the licenced club, progress into top grade football, progress in playing ability and progress in our usual domain, growth.

STANDARD OF PLAY.

Ku-ring-gai football is on the way up. When you see the tables of the Representitive Teams you will see just what a force Ku-ring-gai is becoming in Sydney Soccer. This year 5 Premiership winning teams won their way into the quarter finals of the Champion of Champions Competition and with a little luck for some of them progress could have been much higher.

COACHING

Much of the reason for this show of playing strength is coaching -

more and better coaching. From club coaches, many of whom are from the high pass percentage at the Coaching Course in 1968, to Leo Bosclopper with the Junior Reps, Andy Clues with the Senior Reps and Stuart Sherwin with Ku-ring-gai United. The benefits of the quality and intensity of the coaching in this district is proving to be a very sound investment in the development of the code.

REFEREES.

The H.K.S.R.L. has now truly consolidated its position as an integral part of Soccer in Ku-ring-gai. The standard of both Senior and Junior referees has reached a very satisfactory level and the Referees are thus contributing very largely to the enjoyment of Soccer in Ku-ring-gai.

GROWTH.

Our seams are being stretched as we continue to grow. Our increase this year was 33 teams for 13.2%. We were pleased to have Grace Bros. rejoin the Association and happy to welcome Asquith and Turramurra Methodists to our ranks. We trust their participation will be enjoyable and long. The growth of the code in the schools is pleasing, Corpus Christi & St. Leos both 10 teams, and the increase in size of some of the clubs and their expansion into senior football greatly enhances the depth of the code in more areas of the Association.

GROUNDS.

Because we use more grounds and because they are of a better standard, we contribute a very large proportion of our income to the Councils of the area in which we function. We have reached co-operation with other codes and sports and consequently all are enjoying a share which gives us sufficient facilities with which to operate. We do lack one facility in this regard and that is an enclosed field with parking space which will allow us to adequately promote Senior Football. This must be a project for this Association in this coming year so that 1st Division football will be a possibility in the near future.

GALA DAY.

That we have learnt by some of our mistakes was evidenced by this years efficient Gala Day. Despite the threatening weather we managed to attract our usual large crowd. The successful day proved to be a fitting conclusion to our season.

P & D. C.

This year was a reasonably incident free one, for which we are grateful. Unfortunately some of these incidents were most regrettable. It is pleasing however that an Association of this size has relatively so little trouble in this regard.

SENIOR FOOTBALL.

The M.C. of the K.D.S.A have spent some considerable time this year in negotiation with two Senior Clubs in an endeavour that we might have 1st or 2nd Division football in Ku-ring-gai in 1970. We hope shortly to be in a position to announce a satisfactory conclusion which will mean great strides for Soccer in this District.

In the meantime, Ku-ring-gai United have performed quite well in Amateur League this season and were unlucky not to be semi-finalists, and next year should see some of their players in Grade football.

Our own All Age competition warrents mention in this section of the report because it has become an important feature of Soccer in Ku-ring-gai. It is most pleasing to see so many of the original Ku-ring-gai players now participating in All Age football, which this year provided interesting, exciting and enjoyable football to the adult members of this Association.

FINANCE.

I draw your attention to the Treasurer's Report, which shows a tight reign on the rather large amount of finance handled by this Association. I draw your respect to his comments which are very pertinent to the future development of this Association.

KU-RING-GAI SOCCER CLUB LIMITED.

The requests for the financial support of Soccer followers in the K.D.S.A. have gone out. The club is registered, an offer has been made on a ready made club premises and Council support has been and is being sought. We trust we will be welcoming membership very shortly and the club will be functioning as soon as possible. This will, we hope, allow for an application for a licence in the coming season.

The progress to this stage may have appeared slow, but we feel it has been responsible and thorough. As a result we feel it will be an aquisition not only to Soccer, but to the District as a whole.

CONCLUSION.

I would like to thank all players, parents and officials for their co-operation this year. My special thanks are extended to the efficient members of the M.C, who to a man, have made my task much easier and to Eric Bevan for his updating of Soccer News, which has proved an excellent P.R. project for this Association. My thanks also to the members of those sub-committees who co-operated so well with the M.C. to make 1969 one of our most active years.

1970 will be our biggest year to date. We should see brought to reality our Licenced Club, Senior football and greater success for our interdistrict teams, the prospects look bright, it is now up to the players, officials and supporters of the K.D.S.A. to assure that the result will be to our mutual satisfaction.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

In presenting the attached financial figures I draw attention to the ever increasing costs being encountered by the Association. Part of this is created through continued growth which requires automatic higher outlay for grounds, referees etc. However greatly increased ground fees charged by Councils, a raising of referees' payments to equal those of other districts, greater emphasis on top class coaching for our representative teams, and increased expenditure on our improved "Soccer News" have resulted in our ending the year with only a very small surplus of income over expenditure. Club fees were raised by only 3%, whereas our expenses have jumped by 37%.

While ever the Association is dependent on the affiliated Clubs for its income, a pattern of rising fees must eventuate. I strongly urge each and every Club to encourage its members to support the new Licenced Club to the utmost, so that we can have our own income and thus relieve, and even assist with, the burden that Clubs will be faced with in the future.
