



Procedures for P & D Issues

PLAYERS ORDERED FROM THE FIELD OF PLAY OR CAUTIONED.

IT IS THE PLAYER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING:

Any player ordered from the field of play by the referee must leave the oval **immediately**.

At the conclusion of the match the Team Manager only **must** enquire of the referee as to the offence. The Referee will present the Manager with a form detailing the **exact charge** for which the player was sent off. This form must be taken to the P & D meeting if the player is required to appear, or if the player wishes to challenge an automatic suspension.

The Team Manager must as soon as possible advise their Club Secretary of any Send Off offence.

All players sent from the field of play **must** serve an automatic (1) match suspension, irrespective of the offence committed and notwithstanding the result of a subsequent P & D hearing.

Any player sent off for a second cautionable offence will receive an **automatic (1) match suspension**. No appeal allowed. Any player sent off for this offence for a second time in a season will receive an **automatic (2) match suspension**.

Any player sent off an offence that carries an automatic suspension (please refer to P.D. & D.C. & Appeals Manual 2006) who chooses not to challenge the suspension at the first P & D hearing after the match, will receive the prescribed suspension. The P & D reserves the right to cite players for further action on receipt of the Referee's report.

Players sent off for any other offence **must** appear at the first P & D hearing after the match. Players who fail to appear must not play in any competition matches until they do so.

All suspensions must be served in the next game(s) played by the player's team.

Players who play while suspended will receive an additional (1) match suspension for each game played while suspended.

Players appearing at P & D **must bring their I.D. cards to the hearing**. Failure to do so will result in hearing being postponed. If the player is suspended for 4 matches or more, the card will be retained by P & D Chairman and returned to Club Secretary. If the suspension is less than 4 matches the card will be returned to the player.

CODES OF CONDUCT

All players and parents are obliged to adhere to codes of conduct

These are printed in this book and are on the web site

Referees or officials can report breaches

Players who are unable to attend P & D as required, or who wish to present witnesses, must advise Club Secretary **before the scheduled hearing date**.

Players cited to appear at P & D by the Chairman, for incidents which occur immediately after being sent off, who fail to appear on the requested date **must not play** in competition matches until they appear.

P & D meetings are held each Wednesday evening at 5/27-29 Salisbury Road, Asquith, commencing at 7.30pm. Hearings are heard in order of signing in, with all junior players receiving priority.

Any player (16) years or under should be accompanied by a parent and/ or Club Official.

Players who receive a fourth Yellow Card in the season will receive a (1) match suspension. Those who receive a sixth Yellow Card will receive a (2) match suspension. Additional Yellow Cards may result in the player being cited to appear at P & D. Players to stand down only when advised to by P & D Chairman.

NOTE: Any appeal against a decision of the P & D Committee must be forwarded by your **Club Secretary**, addressed to "The General Manager, KDSA" **within (7) days**, and must include the grounds for the appeal and copies of all documents to be presented. An appeal fee of \$200, paid by Club cheque, must accompany the appeal.
